

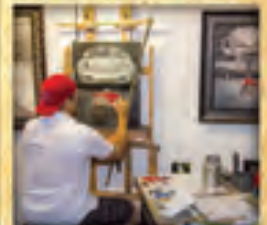

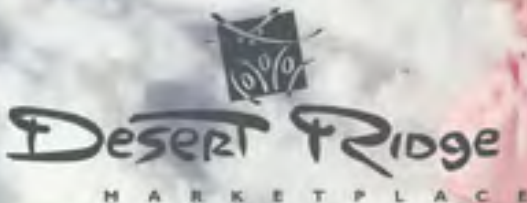

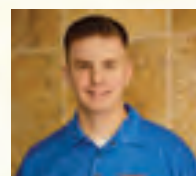

From the President The Future of Desert Ridge

While the Desert Ridge Community Association (DRCA) has many roles, our primary purpose must always be to maximize property values and maintain our community. This isn't a task reserved for just elected board members or our management company, but a responsibility that each of us should share. As residents of Desert Ridge, each of us has an investment in the future of our community and

should participate in the process. The future of Desert Ridge is bright; here are some of the things we'll see in 2017:

Deer Valley Road

In 2017, we'll see a completely new Deer Valley Road from Black Mountain Boulevard West to Cave Creek Road. The road will be expanded to six lanes, plus bike paths, and have stoplights to manage traffic from Reach 11 and the new Sky Crossing development. This project will cost over \$6 Million dollars and should eliminate the traffic and delays we are now experiencing.

Petsmart Dog Park at Reach 11

In January of 2017, construction will begin on the new dog park to be located just South of Pinnacle High School. The park will be complete by May and set a new standard for dog parks in the City of Phoenix. The dog park is the first phase of a larger recreational park facility that will include other parks, sports fields, a pump track for bicycles and court games.

Pinnacle Peak Road

Builders of the Sanctuary development will complete the South half of Pinnacle Peak Road from Tatum Boulevard West to 40th Street. This will require large fills in some areas, but will resolve many of the drainage issues we have experienced. Landscaping will be installed after the road is completed giving this area of our community a much more finished look.

Sky Crossing

While technically not in Desert Ridge, the Sky Crossing Development located on the Northwest corner of Black Mountain Boulevard and Deer

When we purchased our first home in Desert Ridge we were “snow birds”. Each time we arrived a certain neighbor would fill us in on happenings around Desert Ridge. Most with a negative slant. It got to the point we thought of selling our condo. Even though the real estate crash was several years prior property values were still far too low, selling was not an option. So I decided to attend a Desert Ridge Community Association Homeowners meeting just to see what these charlatans were up to. Loaded with all these accusations, I listened and waited for my opportunity to pounce on the board. My opportunity never came. What I discovered was a board dedicated to preserving the integrity of the property values in Desert Ridge. A board that was well organized, a meeting that was well run, board members that openly answered all homeowner’s questions and discussed items on the agenda. I left feeling that maybe my neighbor was misinformed. Several days later she approached me to break more bad news about how the board

was up to new tricks. The trick was about granite replenishment, which was one of the topic of discussions at the meeting. Except her take on the story was 180 degree different than what I witnessed. I explained that I was there and the information she is spreading is not accurate. Determined to prove me wrong she cited several other sources all of whom proved not to be present at the meeting.

Over the next couple of months I returned to the meetings I found the same. Now that is not to say that every decision made by the board pleased individual home owners but they did provide a rational reason why the decision was made.

The point of this story is communications can be a dangerous tool. I relied on bad information and almost sold a home at a significant financial loss. Instead, we moved here to become part of this growing community. And so I got involved.

Today we are subject to so much information and when we rely on information that is not substantiated we can jump to some very costly decisions. That is why we of the Communications Committee have spent so much time working on a revitalization of the Desertridgelifestyles.com website. The goal is to be the hub of communications for the Desert Ridge community.

We will post up to date information, provide relevant information and outbound communications to alert residents of any important information.

Desert Ridge is a growing and thriving community. The Villages at Aviano and Sanctuary at Desert Ridge neighborhoods will add over 400 new households to our growing community once they are completed and built out. The dog park just south of Pinnacle High School is scheduled to open next spring/summer, Deer Valley Road between Black Mountain Boulevard and Cave Creek Road and the south side of Pinnacle Peak Road from Tatum to 40th Street are will be expanded with additional lanes. New restaurants and establishments will be opening on High Street and at the Desert Ridge Marketplace...stay tuned to these forthcoming announcements and much more via the Desert Ridge Lifestyles Magazine, desertridgelifestyles.com website and community eblasts.

Valley Road will begin. This 400+ acre development will have about 1,600 homes and stretch from Deer Valley Road to Pinnacle Peak Road. As you can see, 2017 will bring a great deal of growth and it's important that we manage it carefully to ensure it doesn't negatively impact our neighborhoods.

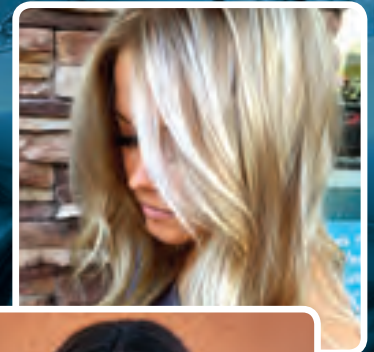
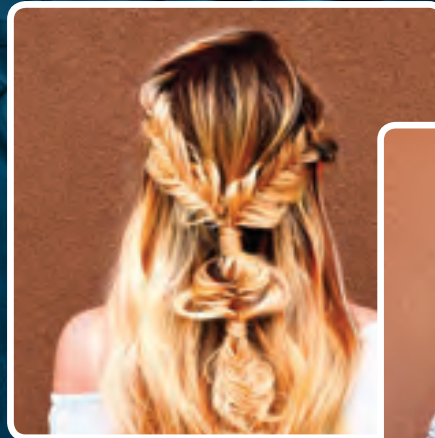

The election results will be announced during the Association's Annual Meeting on Thursday, April 20, 2017. However, there are several steps and events that will take place between now and then.

- **FEBRUARY 19** – Board Candidates Meet and Greet/Q & A at the Farmers Market Cashman Park at Desert Ridge at 11:00 a.m., weather permitting.
- **FEBRUARY 22** – DRCA Board of Directors meeting Board Candidates Meet and Greet/Q&A at 6:00 p.m. at the Desert Ridge Community Associations office.
- **MARCH 19** – Board Candidates Meet and Greet/Q & A at the Farmers Market Cashman Park at Desert Ridge at 11:00 a.m., weather permitting.
- **MARCH 20** – DRCA Ballots for the 2017 election are mailed to all members.
- **APRIL 18** – Mail-in ballots for election of Board of Directors due from all members to the Butler Hansen P.C. office by 5:00 p.m.
- **APRIL 20** – DRCA Annual Meeting and announcement of election results will be held at the JW Marriott Desert Ridge Resort & Spa at 6:00 p.m.

BOARD CANDIDATE QUALIFICATIONS

The qualifications established by the Desert Ridge Community Association's ("Association") Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, Restrictions and Easements for Desert Ridge as recorded and amended (CC&R's) and the Association's Nominating Committee per Section 3.8 of the Association's Bylaws for being nominated to serve on the Board are listed below. Please review each item closely before submitting your candidate application for consideration.

WHAT ALL CANDIDATES MUST DO

Comply with the following requirements per the CC&R's, and must remain in compliance through the Annual Meeting:

- Must be an owner of record in the Association or an entity owner of record in the Association. If you are a representative of a confirmed entity owner of record you must provide a signed, notarized letter from the owner of record, appointing you as its representative.
- Must be a member in good standing, with all assessments current (no more than 30 days delinquent) and no outstanding violation(s) of the CC&R's.
- Must not have member rights suspended by the Board of Directors for any violations of the Association's governing documents.
- Must not be involved in current litigation regarding compliance or dispute with Association's governing documents.

- Must commit to attend regularly scheduled board meetings (at least once a month), as well as the additional time that may be required in order to participate at the committee level.

ADDITIONAL QUALIFICATIONS

Established by the Association's Nominating Committee:

- Must attend at least one of the three scheduled Board Candidates Meet & Greet meetings.
- Must attend the Annual Meeting – 6:00 p.m., Thursday, April 20, 2017. (Note: Should a majority voted member be unable to attend due to an extenuating circumstance the Nominating Committee may determine if said circumstance warrant consideration).
- Must attend the Organizational Meeting scheduled within 5 business days following the Annual Meeting.
- Must attend Board Member training, scheduled within 10 business days following the Annual Meeting.
- Attendance at a Board of Directors Meeting, prior to the election, is strongly suggested. Board meetings are the 4th Wednesday of each month (except April, July and December) at the Desert Ridge Community Association office starting at 6:00 p.m.

Board Candidate FAQ's

What does the Nominating Committee do?

The Nominating Committee's primary function is to ensure that the community has qualified candidates nominated from the Desert Ridge community to serve as Members of the Community Master Association Board of Directors.

What does the Nominating Committee have planned for the upcoming board election year?

This issue contains both the board candidate interest announcement and the requirements and qualifications and email address for the application forms. Several "Meet the Candidate" events have been scheduled so that members of the community can meet prospective Board Members. There will be a Board Candidates "Meet and Greet" at the DRCA Farmers Market Cashman Park at Desert Ridge on Sunday, February 19th at 11:00 AM, a "Meet the Candidate" night at 6:00 PM on Wednesday, February 22nd at the DRCA Board of Directors Meeting and another Board Candidates "Meet and Greet" at the DRCA Farmers Market Cashman Park at Desert Ridge on Sunday, March 19th at 11:00 AM.

How many positions are available this year and how long will my term be?

Out of the seven member seats on the Board of Directors, there are four (4) seats on the Board of Directors that are available for election in 2017. Directors are elected to serve two year terms. In 2017, these four positions will be elected for a two year term since the two year term for these four seats will have expired in April 2017. Therefore, all four positions will serve two year terms.

What is the process for running for a position on the Board?

Contact the Association office at: 480-551-4550 or email to: desertridge.az@fsresidential.com or stop by the Association's office (5415 E. High Street, Suite 220, Phoenix 85054) to obtain the candidate application form.

Return all candidate application forms to the Association office no later than 5:00 PM on Friday, February 10th.

In addition, candidates are required to attend at least one of the three "Meet the Candidate" events. It is strongly recommended that all board candidates attend the Board Candidates Meet & Greet / Q&A to be held during the DRCA Board of Director Meeting on Wednesday, February 22nd at 6:00 PM. Candidates are also encouraged to attend the DRCA Farmers Market Cashman Park at Desert Ridge Board Candidates Meet & Greet / Q&A on Sunday, February 19th at 11:00 AM or Sunday, March 19th at 11:00 AM.

Candidates must also attend the Desert Ridge Community Association Annual Membership Meeting on Thursday, April 20th. **Candidate attendance at this meeting is mandatory!**

What are the Directors' responsibilities?

The Desert Ridge Community Association is an Arizona-chartered, 501(c)(4) nonprofit social welfare organization. Directors are responsible for operating and maintaining the "common area" property of the community, reviewing and approving all site plans and improvements within the community, and providing coordination and oversight of the community subsidiary associations and subdivisions. Luckily, we have a management company that handles most of the day-to-day operations.

What is the time commitment needed while serving on the Board?

The Board typically holds one Open Session and one Executive Session per month, which takes approximately 2-4 hours, combined. There are presently seven standing committees that each have varying meeting schedules determined by their respective committee charter. Depending on which committee you would like to be involved with, an additional 1-2 hours per week may be required. Typically, the time commitment averages about 8 hours a month.

When and where is the Board of Directors Meetings?

The meeting schedule is actually determined by the Board of Directors. Our current meeting schedule is the 4th Wednesday of each month at 6:00 p.m. (except for

the months of April, July and December), at Desert Ridge Community Association Office, Conference Room, 5415 E. High Street, Suite 220, Phoenix 85054.

Do you incur personal liability by serving on the Board?

Generally, as long as a Director acts in good faith with the best interests of the community first, doesn't break any laws, or have any personal benefit, the Association indemnifies the Directors. The Association's Articles of Incorporation provide the most comprehensive explanation of liability. Please read and understand them fully for yourself. The Articles of Incorporation can be found on FirstService Connect, the community information website, or the CD.

How does the election actually work?

There is a one vote per lot for each available position on the board. A qualified Owner will be able to cast one vote for up to 4 candidates.

Do developers and commercial entities get to vote?

Yes, qualified developers and commercial entities are members and get to vote. The Desert Ridge Board is not a Homeowners Association, it is a Community Association. One of the great things about Desert Ridge is that it is still a relatively young development, and only about 40% of the total parceled land have homes built on them. Since the voting is determined per lot, there is still significant involvement by private and commercial developers and the Master Developer. The Master Developer actually casts votes for all land held by the Arizona State Land Dept.

Tips for people who are running.

Get out there and talk to your neighbors – ask them what their concerns are for the community. Let them know you're running. Candidates may speak with developers as well as the commercial interests. And thank you for getting involved!

Neighborly Advice

There is nobody more qualified to spot suspicious activity in a neighborhood than someone who lives there. I feel very strongly that getting to know your neighbors is one of the most important things

you can do to improve our community. Just being in contact with even one neighbor can be a blessing. Are either of you having any trouble with wildlife pests? Solicitors? Did you leave your garage door open? Can you call that neighbor and ask them to check on it? It really adds peace of mind and another layer of protection to be friendly with someone else on your street. This time of year the amount of people who reside in our community increases 10%-15% making winter the best time to reach out. Whether they are a snowbird or full-time resident, take a moment to wave and say hello to your neighbor. Exchange contact info and get their phone number programmed into your cell phone right away. You never know when it's going to come in handy.

By communicating with our neighbors, we can learn who uses which landscaping company, pool cleaning service, etc. This is important because there are communities where individuals posing as landscapers have gone in and stolen expensive plants, yard features, and sprinkler control boxes. In some cases, a neighbor had seen the landscape truck and the

men working in the yard, but did not realize that it wasn't that person's normal landscaper. The same goes for imposter pool cleaners who go into back yards and emerge with expensive pool vacuums, timers and pump motors. These are just a few examples of why getting to know the neighbors can make a huge difference in both personal safety and that of your neighborhood.

Getting to know the neighbors is a process that does not happen overnight. Like any relationship, it can take a little time to develop. I feel very fortunate that my wife and I have gotten to know our neighbors and consider them friends. Although our religious faiths and political opinions may vary, we always manage to focus on the commonality of where we live. We keep an eye on each other's homes when one of us is out of town. We alert one another when Solicitor's are going door to door. Over the last few years we have been there for each other, we have rescued lost pets, helped to have rattlesnakes relocated, and warned each other when bobcats were roaming the neighborhood. Through our lines of communication we even helped The Phoenix Police department apprehend a criminal, who made the mistake



of targeting our neighborhood. This would not of happened if we had never met each other.

You and your neighbors can be an integral part in the fight against crime, but we don't expect you to do it alone. The Community Awareness Committee is always striving to make our community a safer and better place to live. We work with the Phoenix Police Department, our security patrol providers, HOA representatives, and Block Watch leaders to form strategies for reducing crime and keeping property values high in Desert Ridge. The Community Awareness Committee continues to carry the support of the DRCA Board of Directors who unanimously voted to approve the recent recommendations made by the committee. These recommendations included an increase in the off-duty patrols by the City of Phoenix Police Department as well as additional patrols by Urban Tactical Security. We have also renewed our agreement with Silent Witness to match the reward paid for anonymous tips on criminal activity that occurs in Desert Ridge.

To promote better awareness we will continue to provide our residents with tips on how to better protect themselves, their homes, and their families through this publication, e-blasts, and on desertridgelifestyles.com.

MIM TO HOST SPECIAL EXHIBITION

DRAGONS AND VINES: Inlaid Guitar Masterpieces

Museum Welcomes Unique Instruments from Master Inlay Artists and Manufacturers

NOW THRU SEPTEMBER 4, 2017

Dragons and Vines: Inlaid Guitar Masterpieces presents a collection of instruments featuring stunning inlay design created by the greatest contemporary North American inlay artists and luthiers. The exhibition is presented in partnership with the Maryland-based inlay company Pearl Works, with the majority of the pieces coming from the private collection of Larry Sifel (1948—2006), the company’s founder.

Each of the instruments vividly illustrates the transformation of bold imagination into reality, from snarling dragons to delicate floral patterns as well as re-creations of historic artwork and hot-rod automobiles. Some of the instruments go beyond sheer refinement of the artwork and actually tell the stories of the artists. All of the instruments displayed are of limited edition or one-of-a-kind creations, many of which have never before been on public display.

This special exhibition consists of guitars, banjos, and one ukulele, featuring inlaid artwork created from materials including abalone shell, mother-of-pearl, gold, copper, wood, and others. These materials are manually fitted onto the instruments with diligent precision, transforming each one into a unique masterpiece. Highlights of the exhibition include:

■ **“Dragon 2002” Electric Guitar, 2002, Pearl Works, Paul Reed Smith (PRS) Guitars** – Designed by Jeff Easley, an independent designer, this guitar depicts a close-up view of a dragon’s head covering almost 90 percent of the body. The materials used include shells, mammoth ivory, and other exotic elements. Once the design was installed on the guitar, the surface was airbrushed by Paul Boyd, a longtime PRS employee.

■ **“Martin D-50 Koa Deluxe” Acoustic Guitar, 2003, Pearl Works, C. F. Martin & Co.** – This instrument’s inlaid work depicts Martin’s traditional “Tree of Life” design. The vine patterns are cut from dark-heart abalone shell and are outlined in mother-of-pearl. Prior to Sifel’s involvement, the Martin guitar company was unable to expand any “standard” production models with this level of decoration because it could not effectively be duplicated beyond the one-off examples.

■ **“Night Dive” OM Guitar, 2004, Pearl Works, C. F. Martin & Co.** – This instrument illustrates the process of collecting shells for inlay. The center of the fretboard depicts divers collecting abalone shells, rendered as if seen through rippling water. Chuck Erikson, known as the “Duke of Pearl,” holds a lantern that lights the scene and gathers the shells that the divers collect. Sifel is depicted with his power saw inside

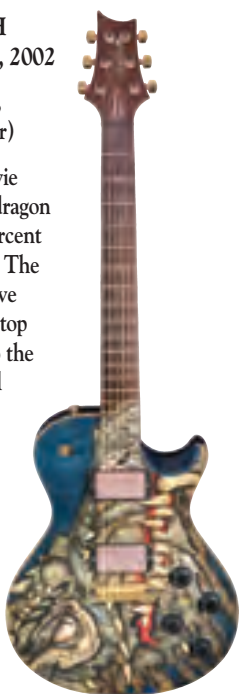


a boat, and Grit Laskin, an inlay artisan, is peering into the scene from behind the boat. The materials for this piece include reconstituted stone and Corian.

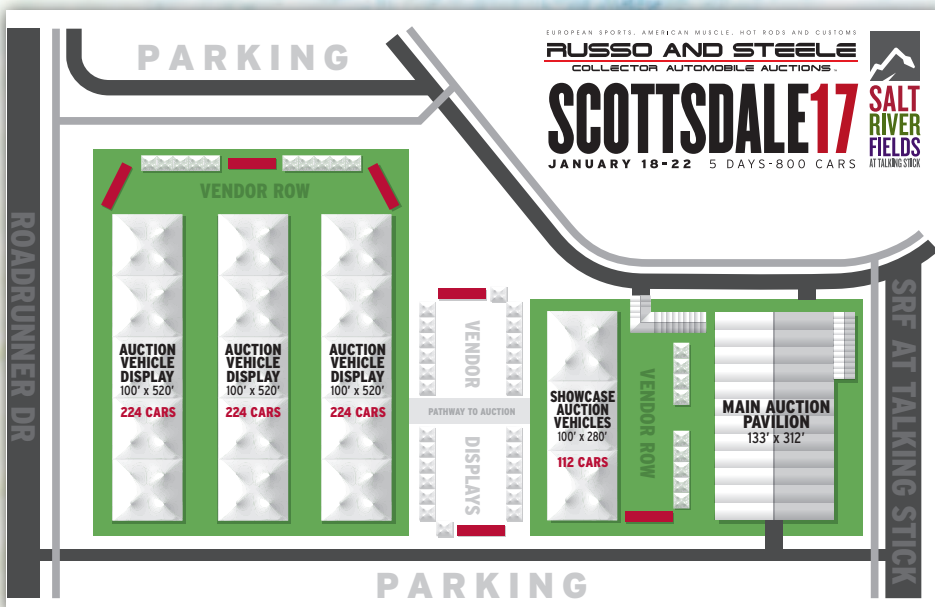

What started out with just 10 sites, is now a national program found in more than 300 communities in the United States with over 50,000 active members. The program has introduced to more than 300,000 young girls to the game of golf. The LPGA-USGA Girls Golf program

remains the tournament's top beneficiary.
