SCHOOL NEWS

- ★ AP TESTING AP testing is May 4th through May 15th.
- ★ FOOD DELIVERIES Per school policy, and for the safety of you and your student, we only accept individual food deliveries from a student's parent/guardian or emergency contact. Students will not be able to wait in the front office area or anywhere else for food deliveries. Items may be left in the front office by parents in the shelving area provided. Putting items in the shelving unit is done at your own risk, as the school is not responsible for lost or stolen items. To minimize classroom disruptions, we do not deliver items or messages to the classroom, or call students out of class.
- ★ ATTENDANCE Regular attendance is the key to student success. Students should remain out of school only when absolutely necessary, such as in the event of an illness. Students must be fever-free without medication for 24 hours before returning to school. Pinnacle High School Attendance Line: (602) 449-4001

General Attendance Procedures: Parents of absent students are expected to notify the attendance office by phone on the day of absence and before 3:00pm. If notification is not made to the school before 3:30pm, the absence will be considered unexcused. A phone dialer system will notify parents of unexcused absences.

- Pre-planned absences can be reported to the attendance office by phone in advance of the day of the absence.
- Notify the attendance office on the morning of a pre-planned early departure. The
 attendance office will prepare a Request for Student permit that will allow a student
 to leave the classroom for excused early dismissal. Students are responsible for
 picking up the Request for Student permit before school or in passing periods.
 Students will not be called out of class when prior notification has not been given to
 the attendance office, or if the student fails to pick up the Request for Student
 permit.
- Always check in and check out through the attendance office when arriving late or leaving early. Failure to check out through the attendance office prior to leaving

- school during school hours is a violation of leaving school grounds without permission and the absence will be recorded as unexcused. A person picking up a student must be listed on the student's emergency card and show valid photo I.D. A parent must call ahead for a student to be excused and released to an emergency contact
- If a person not listed on the emergency card is coming to pick up a student(s), the parent must call ahead of time to inform the attendance office. That individual will need to present a photo ID in order for a student to be released to that person.
- Check in with the Health Center to report illness or injury that occurs during school hours. Only the school nurse can determine if a student is too ill to remain on campus. The Health Center will notify attendance when students are released early because of illness or injury.

★ PARKING UPDATE Please be aware that any students whose car registration is set to expire will need to provide a copy of a *new*, *valid* AZ Vehicle Registration prior to or at the time of expiration, per policy. Any student whose vehicle registration has expired may not

park on PVUSD property until valid registration is obtained. Students who need to submit a renewed vehicle registration should bring their documentation to the office for us to update their file.

- ★ GOOD NEIGHBOR POLICY Pinnacle would like to remind all stakeholders that we practice a "good neighbor policy." We ask that everyone be mindful of where you can and cannot park in the surrounding neighborhoods. Parking in these areas during the day, or during drop off and pick up can cause a safety concern if too many cars are parked or moving in areas that have high foot traffic.
- ★ STUDENT DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP As a reminder: Student drop-off and pick-up occurs through the entrance to the East student parking lot and along the school-side of Mayo Blvd. only. Pedestrians should only cross in designated crosswalks. We understand traffic can be frustrating, however we ask that all drivers follow these practices to ensure the safety of all students. Please refrain from dropping off or picking up students on the North (desert) side of Mayo, and remind your student to use the pedestrian bridge to cross Black Mountain Blvd. as students not using the crosswalks create significant safety hazards and are close to being hit on a regular basis.

EXCLUDES All Invitational, Regional and State AIA Games.
 - Cost \$95 per school year.
- ★ Student Pass: Allows Pinnacle student only entry to all Pinnacle regular season games only. This pass is not valid at other PV District or Non PV District High Schools. <u>EXCLUDES All Invitational</u>, <u>Regional and State AIA Games</u>. These can be purchased through the <u>Webstore</u> or in the Bookstore inside the ITC.
 - Cost \$50 per school year.

- ★ EMERGENCY/MEDICATION CARDS: Students, who do not have updated emergency cards on file, were called down last week to get a new card to take home. Please make sure to sign off on the emergency card and have your student turn it into the counseling office, ASAP.
- ★ Pinnacle High School is a DRUG-FREE CAMPUS. All prescription and nonprescription/ over-the-counter meds must be kept in the Nurse's office stored in their original container.
- ★ If a student needs to leave campus due to illness, they will need to make their way down to the Nurse's Office to be evaluated. If the Nurse feels it is necessary for the student to leave campus, arrangements will be made with a parent/guardian. If your student suffers from allergies, asthma, diabetes, seizures, or carries an EpiPen, inhaler or insulin please come by the Nurse's Office to fill out an Action Plan which needs to be completed and updated each school year.
